Who we are

The Black and Coloured Sheep Breeders' Association of New Zealand (Inc) is a national, non-profit incorporated society founded in 1976. A member body of the Royal Agricultural Society, we have about 350 members.

Members range from small block owners to those with large commercial flocks. Some members do not own sheep, but have an interest in coloured sheep and wool.

Where we are

We are in most parts of New Zealand, from Northland to Southland.

The twelve branches are the basis for member participation.

These branches are:

- Waikato
- Bay of Plenty
- Hawkes Bay
- Wairarapa
- Manawatu
- Nelson
- North Canterbury
- Mid Canterbury
- South Canterbury/Waitaki
- Silverpeaks/Otago
- Southland

What we do

Individually:

- Members aim to improve their flocks, in order to produce well grown sheep and quality wool for both handcraft and commercial use.
- Some produce fleeces for handspinning, weaving or felting.
- Some are involved in the commercial production of natural coloured yarns and other products.
- Others specialize in breeding for high quality sheepskins.
- Some breeders keep a purebred flock of a particular breed. After inspection the flock may be registered with the Registered Breeds section of the Association

Locally:

- Branches provide varied programmes, such as field days, flock visits and discussions.
- Branch activities may include promotions and displays, as well as social events.
- Branches encourage participation in sheep and wool sections at A&P Shows.

What we do

Nationally:

- We publish a magazine regularly and a Flock Book each year.
- We organize sheep sales and judging schools.
- We hold an annual conference which includes fleece and other competitions.

Internationally:

- Every 5 years a World Congress for breeders of natural coloured sheep is held, to share information, ideas and friendship. Host countries have been:
 - New Zealand (1984)
 - USA (1989)
 - United Kingdom (1994)
 - Australia (1999)
 - New Zealand (2004)
 - Brazil (2009)

The next Congress is still to be arranged.
