

## HANDCRAFT COMPETITION

The craft aggregate and best exhibit trophies can only be won by a BCSBA member.

All entries must be made from natural coloured or spotted sheep fleece.

Samples of fleece or yarn used must be supplied.

**Class 1 A handspun skein of novelty yarn, not less than 50 grams**

Must use natural coloured wool.

Other fibre may be used as binding.

**Class 2 Child's toy**

100% natural coloured wool and up to 25% overdyeing allowed.

Other fibre allowed for stuffing and trim.

Safety and suitability of design and materials will be considered as part of the judging.

**Class 3 Wall hanging/picture**

Any medium.

Using 100% natural coloured wool.

**Class 4 Adults vest/waistcoat**

Any technique.

Any yarn used must be handspun.

**Class 5 OPEN**

Cushion cover - any technique.

Minimum size 35 cm square.

Natural coloured wool; option to use 25% overdyeing with natural dyes.

Must state dye source and include sample of fleece or yarn used.

## PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION

All photos 150 mm x 100 mm (6" x 4").

Photos must have been taken during the two years preceding the date of entry and must include coloured sheep unless otherwise specified.
